Having the right mindset and attitude towards your work is all-important. You need to feel confident from the word go, but not so much so that you end up making mistakes.




### **Quality is everything**

- To what level
- A little background about work experience
- Your experience as a copywriter
- Who inspires you



## **Finding Niches**

Finding the sort of niches you feel comfortable writing about can take a bit of time, which could be thought of as a period of "trial and error".

This trial and error period is well worth going through because ultimately it allows you to find out which topics you are good at writing about so you can start focussing on these when searching for jobs.
